EAST COCALICO TOWNSHIP TRANSPORTATION IMPACT FEE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING TUESDAY, OCTOBER 19, 2021

The advertised meeting of the East Cocalico Township Transportation Impact Fee Advisory Committee was called to order on Tuesday, October 19, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., held in-person at the East Cocalico Township Municipal Building, 100 Hill Road, Denver, PA 17517 by following the CDC guidelines of social distancing.

The Tuesday, October 19, 2021 Transportation Impact Fee Advisory Committee meeting did not have a quorum, and those in attendance agreed to continue the meeting as discussion items only. No decisions were be made. These minutes reflect a very brief synopsis of the items discussed.

This meeting was duly advertised in the Lancaster New Era on July 28, 2021.

Chairman Sahm noted that three volunteers noted their interest: June Kinback, Kerry Haas, Allen Maxwell.

<u>ORGANIZATION – MEMBERSHIP UPDATE</u>: Chairman Sahm read the names of people interested in being on the TIF Advisory Committee. To date, letters of interests were received from June Kinback, Kerry Haas, and Allen Maxwell. Discussions held.

Mr. Jeff Shenk introduced himself to the TIF Committee, noting that he is filling in for Ed Crème and Matt Crème. Mr. Shenk indicated that he made an observation tonight, noting that there is not a quorum for tonight's TIF Advisory Committee Meeting. The meeting could proceed lawfully for tonight's Advisory Committee, but the Committee would be unable to take action or make any recommendations. The meeting proceeded as discussions only.

APPROVAL OF PAST MEETING MINUTES: The minutes were reviewed. No motion was made on the meeting minutes, noting that these minutes will be brought before the next upcoming TIF meeting.

DISCUSSION CONCERNING THE NEW PUBLISHED ITE TRIP GENERATIONAL MANUAL, 11TH EDITION AND THE IMPACTS ON THE TIF CALCULATIONS IN EAST COCALICO TOWNSHIP: Mr. Schick discussed, noting the methodologies of the Trip Generational Manual 11th edition has not changed. Discussions continued. Comments and questions were asked which were answered. No decisions or motions were made.

Hession highlighted the August report on what expenses were going out from the Financial Administrator.

- o RED RUN EXHAUST: Paid their first portion of \$3,775.00 for TIF
- o INGHAM POWDER COATING: Two-year deferment had expired at the beginning of October
- o EARTH, TURF AND WOOD: Picked up their permit (initially given two-year deferment)
- o PRESIDENTIAL CABINETS: LERTA deferment, payment not due until the end of 2022
- o FOUR SEASONS PRODUCE: Internal documentation noted payment received (archive records to be pulled for confirmation)

CURRENT TRAFFIC IMPACT STUDY – TRAFFIC ANALYSIS & CONCEPT PLAN – CHURCH STREET AND SR 272 INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS: Mr. Hession discussed the traffic analysis and concept plan with Rettew, to look at Church Street and SR 272 intersection improvements, and was directed to use TIF monies to cover that cost. Mr. Schick discussed further. Lengthy discussions continued. Comments and questions were asked which were answered.
